- Mary Seacole was born in Kingston, Jamaica on 23rd November 1805.
- Her father was a Scottish soldier and her mother was a Jamaican 'doctress' or healer.
- The Crimean War began on 16th October 1853 and lasted for 3 years.
- Mary wanted to help treat the wounded soldiers there but was turned away due to the colour of her skin.
- In 1857, a book about her life was published. It was the first autobiography to be written by a black woman in Britain.
- Mary died on 14th May 1881, aged 76.
- Amelia Mary Earhart born was born July 24, 1897 in Kansas. USA
- During a trip to visit her parents in 1920, Amelia took her first airplane ride with famed World War I pilot, Frank
- Amelia worked hard to purchase her first plane. She nicknamed it "The Canary," because of its bright yellow colour.
- She was the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean.
- In 1937 she attempted to fly around the world with her navigator but sadly the disappeared and they were never seen again.
- Nobody knows what happened and the plane was never found.


